Demands

1. Immediate restoration of ACP Scheme and granting minimum ₹ 6600/- Grade Pay to all AEs after 24 years along with one time relaxation to opt for MACPS as on 01/09/08 to those AEs and EEs who already got 2 upgradations under ACPS.
2. Time bound approval of ₹ 7600/- Grade Pay to all eligible AEs & EEs as per MACPS.
3. Immediate adhoc promotions of AE to EE against all existing vacancies i/c cadre review posts in Civil and Electrical streams in both Diploma and Degree quotas as per CAT (PB)'s orders dated 04/05/12 ensuring SC/ST quota.
4. Re-designation of the post of AE as Deputy EE as already approved by UD Minister in line with other posts like ADG(spl.) as Spl. DG, PCE as ADG, D' Man as Estimator etc. as per DoPT's clarification empowering UD Ministry to re-designate any post.
5. Abolition of departmental accounts exams for AEs & EEs by replacing the same with induction training in accounts on promotion for releasing increments.
6. Removal of anomaly in the initial pay scale of AE by correcting the contradiction in para 3.4.7 and 7.46.12 of 6th CPC Report.
7. Immediate amendment of Recruitment Rules of AE to EE as per DoPT's rules with failing which clause while protecting the interest of all incumbent Diploma AEs.
8. Immediate restoration of approved final seniority lists of AEs and

EEs published during the years 2002 & 2004 respectively as per Delhi High Court's orders.

9. Approval & Notification of amended Transfer & Posting guidelines of EEs & SEs with rotation between field and planning and declaration of IT Valuation/QA posts etc. as sensitive planning posts instead of field posts.
10. Immediate regularization of all adhoc AEs by holding regular DPCs from 2007 to 12.
11. Grant of ₹ 7500-12000/- scale to all eligible AEs as per seniority and release of arrears stopped by various PAOs to those AEs who are already granted the scale.
12. Simplification of manual procedures with enhanced delegated powers to field officers along with implementation of cadre restructuring.
13. Regularization of adhoc EEs as per UPSC's approved panel in the year 2004 and holding regular DPCs for balance vacancies as there is no stay by any court.
14. Restoration of open MHA Passes to all AEs.
15. Increase in tender powers of AEs to at least ₹ 10 lacs in view of e-tendering.
16. Grant of Design and Planning allowance @ 20% of basic pay to AEs & EEs.
17. Improvement in working condition of AEs and EEs.

OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject : Children Education Allowance/Hostel Subsidy - Clarification -

-
1. Subsequent to clarifications issued vide O.M. No. 12011/3/2008-Estt.

(Allowance) dated 11.11.2008 and O.M. No. 12011/08/2010-Estt. (AL) dated 30.12.2010 on the captioned subject, references have been received on (i) definition of the term "station" and (ii) admissibility of Hostel Subsidy and Children Education Allowance in respect of children pursuing diploma/certificate courses from Polytechnic/ITI/Engineering College, after passing 10th standard.

2. After due consideration of the references in consultation with the Department of Expenditure, the following has been decided :
 - a. The term Hostel Subsidy would mean expenses incurred by the Government servant if he/she keeps his/her children in a hostel of a residential school/institution located beyond a distance of 50 kilometres from his/her residence. The reimbursement would be subject to other conditions laid down in the O.M. dated 2.9.2008 and subsequent instructions issued from time to time. It is further clarified that grant of hostel subsidy is not related to transfer liability of the Government servant.
 - b. To allow reimbursement of Children Education Allowance/Hostel Subsidy for the initial two years of a diploma/certificate course from Polytechnic/ITI/Engineering College, if the child pursues the course after passing 10th standard and the Government servant has not been granted CEA/Hostel Subsidy in respect of the child for studies in 11th and 12th standards. This is further subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the O.M. dated 2.9.2008 and subsequent instructions issued from time to time.
3. This comes into effect from the current academic year.

Children Education Allowance Scheme (CEA)		
1.	Whether Reimbursement of Children Education Allowance (CEA) for 3rd Child is permissible if CEA has not been claimed for 1st and 2nd child? As per OM dated 2.9.2008 CEA is admissible does it mean any two school going children?	As per OM No. 12011/03/2008-Estt.(AL) dated 11.11.2008, the children Education Allowance would be admissible for more than two children in case the number of children exceeds two as a result of the second child birth resulting in twins or multiple birth. This implies that CEA will be admissible only in the cases of two eldest surviving children and CEA for third or subsequent child will only be permissible if there is a case of multiple births at the time of second child birth. Further, reimbursement of CEA for the 3rd child is admissible in case of failure of sterilization operation.
2.	What constitute "Fee" as per para 1(e) of the O.M. dated 2/9/2008 and whether fee paid for extra-curricular activities to some other institute and Annual charges, Transportation fees are reimbursable? Reimbursement towards purchase of school bag, water bottle, uniform, shoes and stationary is admissible?	As per OM No. 12011/03/2008-Estt.(AL) dated 2.9.2008, tuition fee, admission fee, laboratory fee, special fee charged for agriculture, electronics, music or any other subject, fee charged for practical work under the programme of work experience, fee paid for the use of any aid or appliances by the child library fee, games/sports fee and fee for extra-curricular activities are reimbursable subject to the condition that the aforementioned fee are charged by the school directly from the student. Besides, reimbursement for purchase of one set of text books and notebooks, two sets of


		uniforms prescribed by the school in which the child is studying, one pair of shoes, in an academic year are reimbursable. uniform include all items of clothing prescribed for a day, as uniform by the school, irrespective of colours/winter/summer/PT uniforms. There is no item-wise ceiling. Reimbursement of pens/pencils, school bags,etc.,may not be allowed.
3.	Whether Development Fee/ Parents' contribution charged by the school/ institution is reimbursable?	Development Fee/Parents' Contribution in lieu of tuition fee shall be reimbursed w.e.f. 21st February, 2012 on pro-rata basis, subject to the condition that the Govt. servant will have to certify that the school does not charge the tuition fee.
4.	Whether reimbursement of fee charged directly by the school for catering to the special needs of the child with disabilities duly certified by the concerned school mentioned in para 1(e) of O.M. dated 2.9.2008, is permissible?	Reimbursement of fee charged directly by the school for catering to the special needs of the child with disabilities duly certified by the concerned school authorities, in addition to items mentioned in para 1(e) of O.M. dated 2.9.2008, is allowed w.e.f. 21st February 2012, on pro-rata basis.
5.	Whether CEA had been increased by 25% as a result of enhancement of Dearness Allowances beyond 50%?	This Department's OM No. 12011/03/2008-Estt.(AL) dated 2.9.2008 clearly indicates that the limits "would be automatically raised by 25% every time the dearness Allowance on the revised pay structure goes up by 50%." There is no need for any separate order from this Department to effect enhancement of CEA as a Result of increase in DA of CEA as a result of increase in DA by

		50% . However, O.M. No.12011/01/2011-Estt.(Allowance) dated 4th May 2011, has been issued to clarify this further.
6.	Whether CEA has been increased by 25% as a result of enhancement of Dearness Allowances beyond 50%?	The reimbursement of CEA is not linked to the performance of the child in his class. Even if a child fails in a particular class, the reimbursement is permissible. However, if the child is admitted in the same class in another school, although the child has passed out of the same class in previous out of the same class in previous school or in the midsession, CEA shall not be reimbursable.
7.	Whether Hostel subsidy is reimbursable irrespective of transfer liability?	Hotel subsidy is reimbursable to all Central Govt. employees for keeping their ward in the Hostel of a residential school away from the station in which the employee is posted or residing irrespective of any transfer liability.
8.	Whether reimbursement can be allowe in case the original receipts are misplaced and duplicate receipts are produced by the government servant?	In case of misplacement of receipts given by the school/institution towards charges received from the parents/guardian, reimbursement may be allowed if the Govt. servant produces a duplicate receipt, duly authenticated by the school authorities. Receipts from private parties, other than the school, if misplaced shall not be entertained, even if a duplicate receipt from school authorities need not be attested/countersigned/rubber stamped by the school authorities.
9.	Whether a Govt. servant is allowed to get 50% of the	Reimbursement of 50% of the entitled amount for the academic year could be

	total amount subject to the overall annual ceiling in the first quarter and the remaining amount in third and or fourth quarter?	allowed in the first and/or second quarter and the remaining amount could be reimbursed in the third and/or fourth quarter. However, the entire entitled amount can be reimbursed in the last quarter. Frontloading of the entire admissible amount is not permissible.
10.	Whether any age limit has been prescribed for reimbursement of CEA?	There is no minimum age prescribed for reimbursement of CEA in respect of children admitted in nursery classes. The minimum age of 5 years, stipulated in office Memorandum No.12011/03/2008-Est.(Allowance) dated 11th November, 2008, for disabled children pursuing non-formal education or vocational training stands removed with effect from 21st February, 2012. Hence, there will be no minimum age for any child for whom reimbursement is claimed. The upper age limit for disabled children has been set at 22 years of age. In case of other children, the age limit will be 20 years age or till the time of passing 12th Class whichever is earlier.
11.	Whether the school/institution should be recognized?	The school/institution has to be recognized by the central or state Govt. or UT central administration or by University or a recognized educational authority having jurisdiction over the area where the institution is situated.
12.	Whether CEA is payable for the children of central Govt. employees and studying abroad, including children of citizens of Nepal/Bhutan but	The CEA is payable for the children of all central government employees including citizens of Nepal/Bhutan, who are employees of Govt. of India, and whose children are studying abroad. However, a

	working in Govt. of India, and the children are studying in the schools in their native place, i.e. Nepal/Bhutan?	certificate may be obtained from the Indian Mission abroad that the school is recognised by the educational authority having jurisdiction over the area where the institution is situated.
13.	Whether Children Education Allowance would be admissible beyond two children due to failure of sterilization operation.	The reimbursement of children Educational Allowance is admissible only for the first child born after failure of sterilization operation .
Joining Time Rules		
14.	Whether joining time/joining time pay is admissible to join another Govt. organisation.	For appointment to posts under the Central Govt. on the results of a competitive examination and or interview open to govt. servants and others, central government employees and permanent/provisionally permanent/provisionally permanent state Govt. employees will be entitled to joining time. A Govt. servant shall be treated on duty during the period of joining time and shall be entitled to joining time pay equal to the pay and allowance like DA, HRA, CCA, drawn before relinquishment of charge at the old post. But temporary Central Government employees with less than 3 years of regular continuous service, though entitled to joining time would not be entitled to joining time pay.
Overtime Allowance		
15.	Revision of rates of overtime Allowance.	The 5th and 6th Central Pay Commission have recommended abolition of grant of Overtime Allowance but the govt. has decided to maintain the status quo at the existing rates till implementation of Performance Related Incentive Scheme.

16.	Whether the women employees with disabilities shall be entitled for allowance at double the rates of first child birth?	No. In Case of multiple births at the time of first child birth, the woman employee shall not be entitled to this allowance at double the rates for multiple births.
17.	Whether the allowance would be admissible for the 3rd child in case either of the first two children i.e. first child or the 2nd child expires before the attaining the age of two years?	It is clarified that the grant of special Allowance for the child care for women with disabilities is admissible for two years from the birth of the child so long as the woman employee does not have more than two surviving children.
